“The Mission Statement of the Hopi Senom Transit system is to provide the Hopi reservation and surrounding areas with affordable, accessible and reliable rural transportation to the Hopi people and general public”.

History

The Hopi Senom Transit was established in 1986 to provide the general public and employees of local government and private sector agencies with fixed-route transportation services on the Hopi reservation and surrounding areas.

Rural Transit Program-Section 5311

The Hopi Senom Transit program is funded by the Hopi Tribe General Fund and the Arizona Department of Transportation, Section 5311, Rural Public Transportation Program.

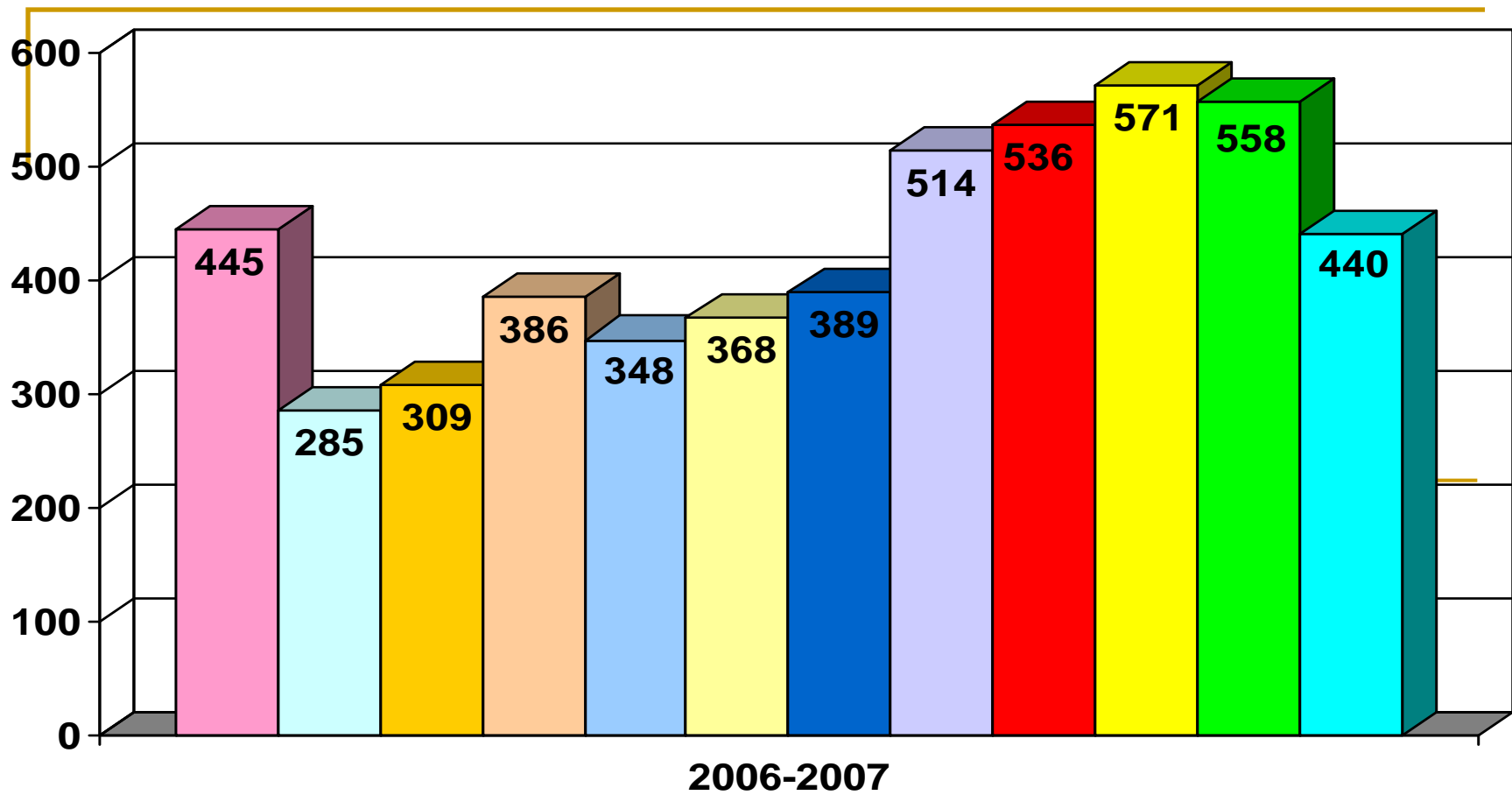
Section 5311 provides pass-through funding reimbursing the Hopi Transit program for administrative, operations, training and capital expenses for managing the public transportation service.

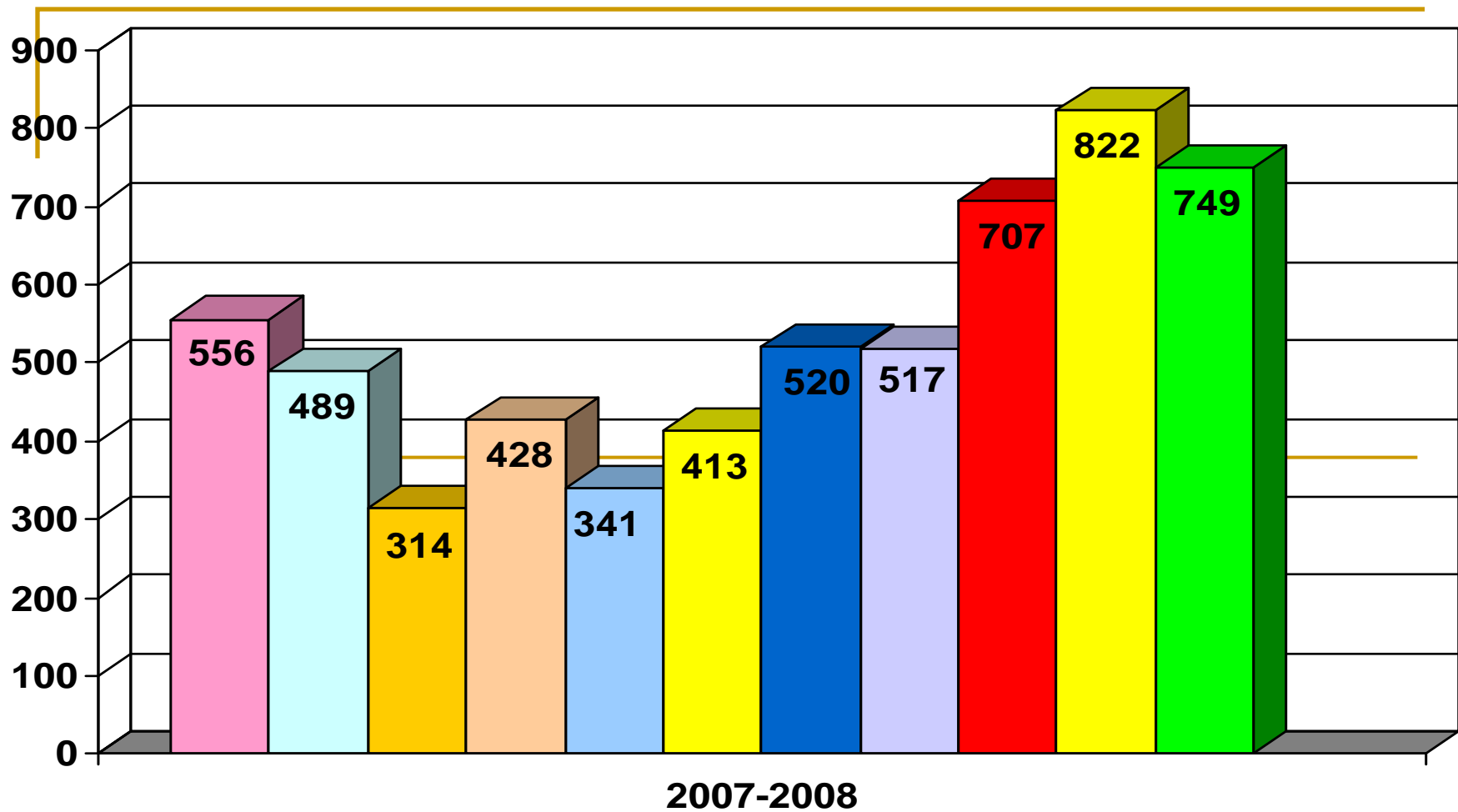

NUMBER OF PASSENGERS SERVED 2006-2007

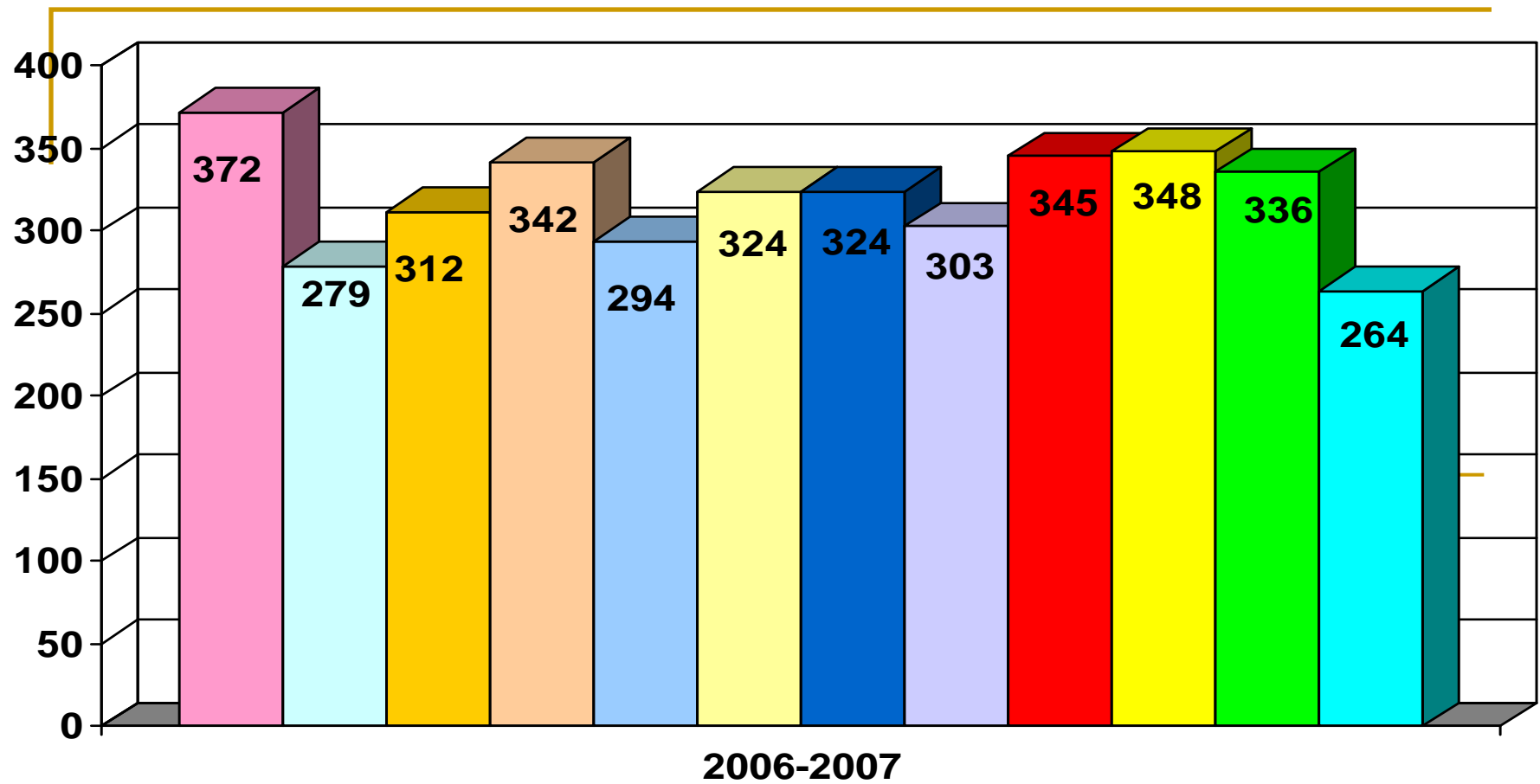


NUMBER OF PASSENGERS SERVED 2007-2008

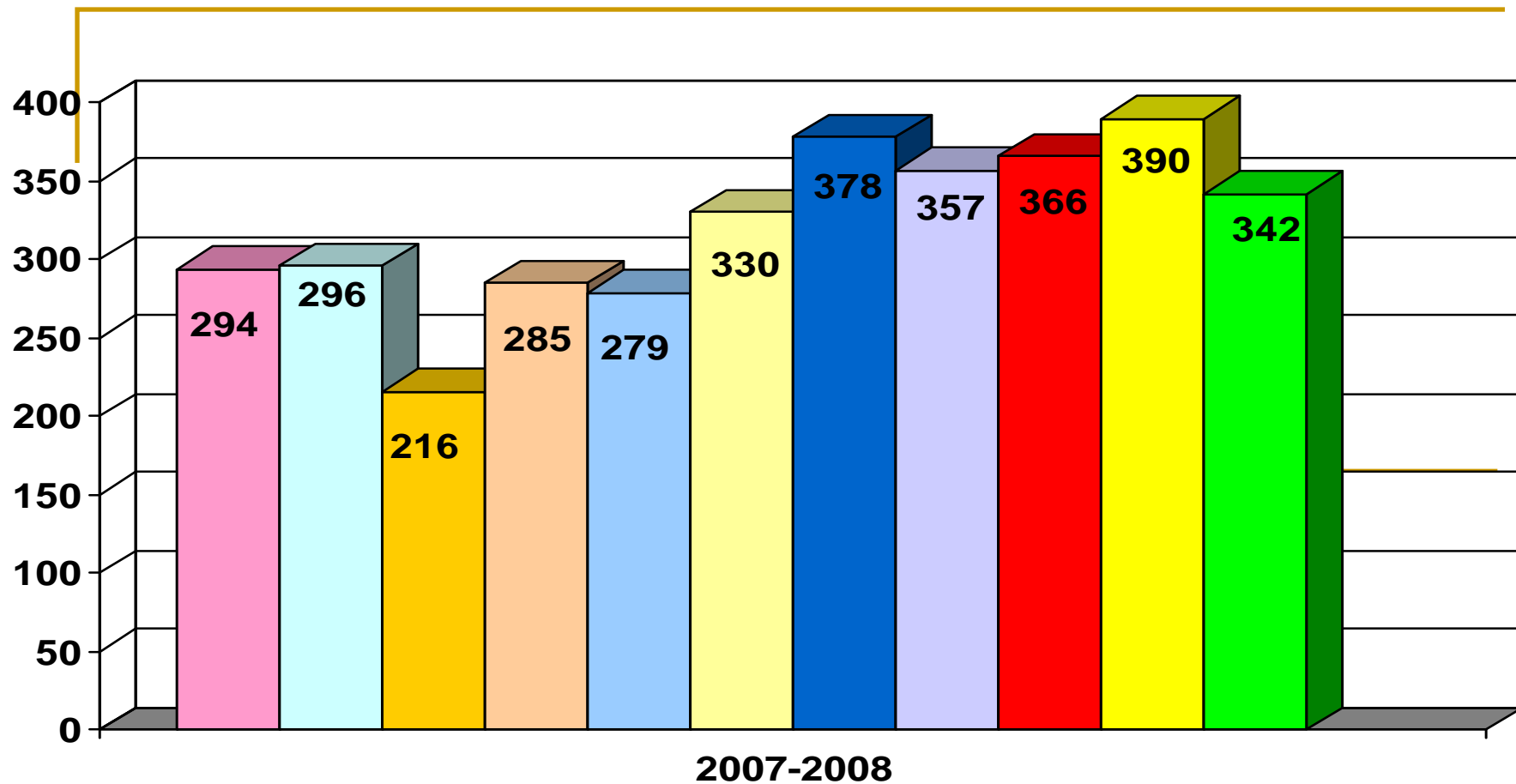

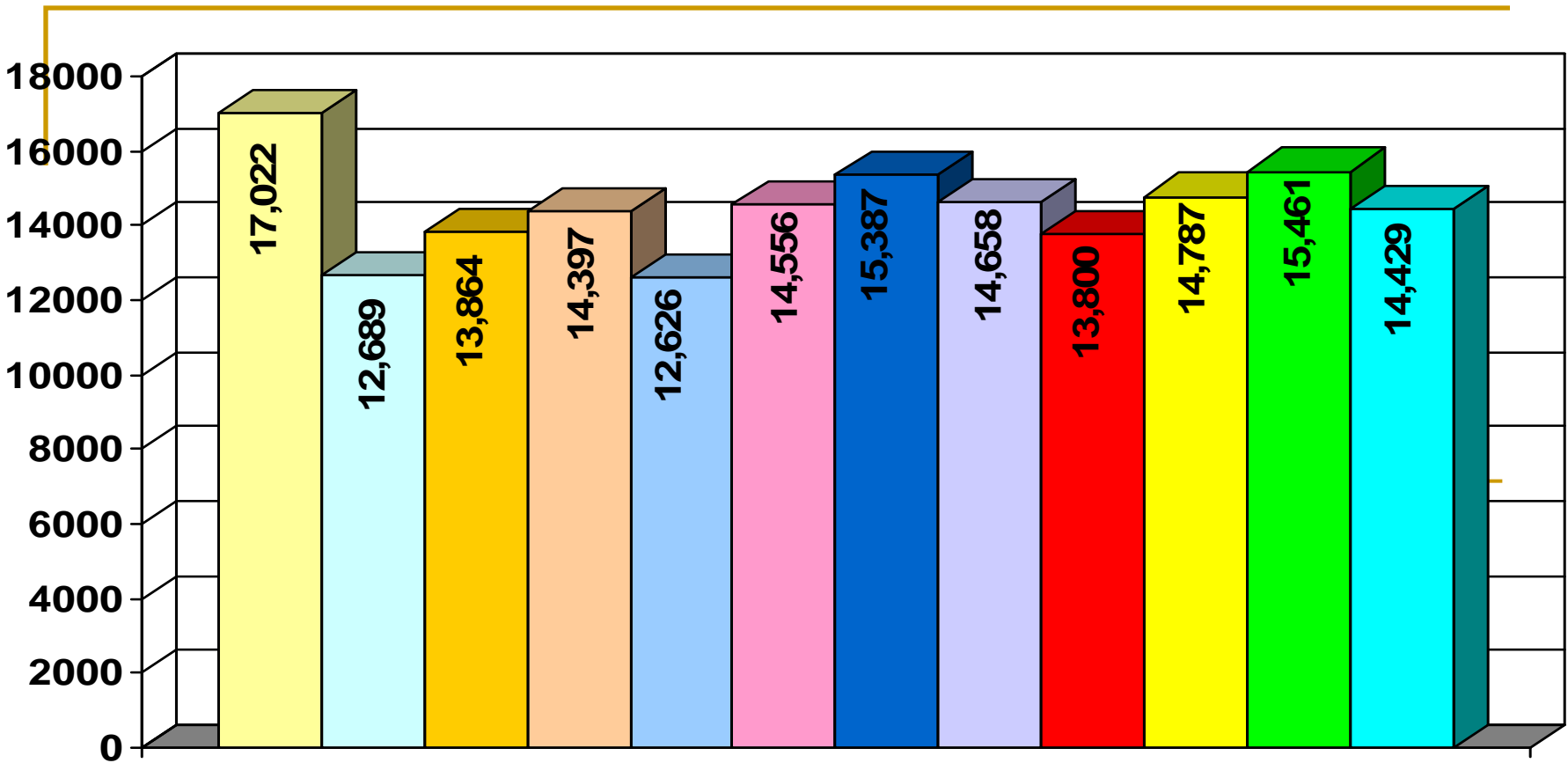
VEHICLE SERVICE HOURS 2006-2007



VEHICLE SERVICE HOURS 2007-2008



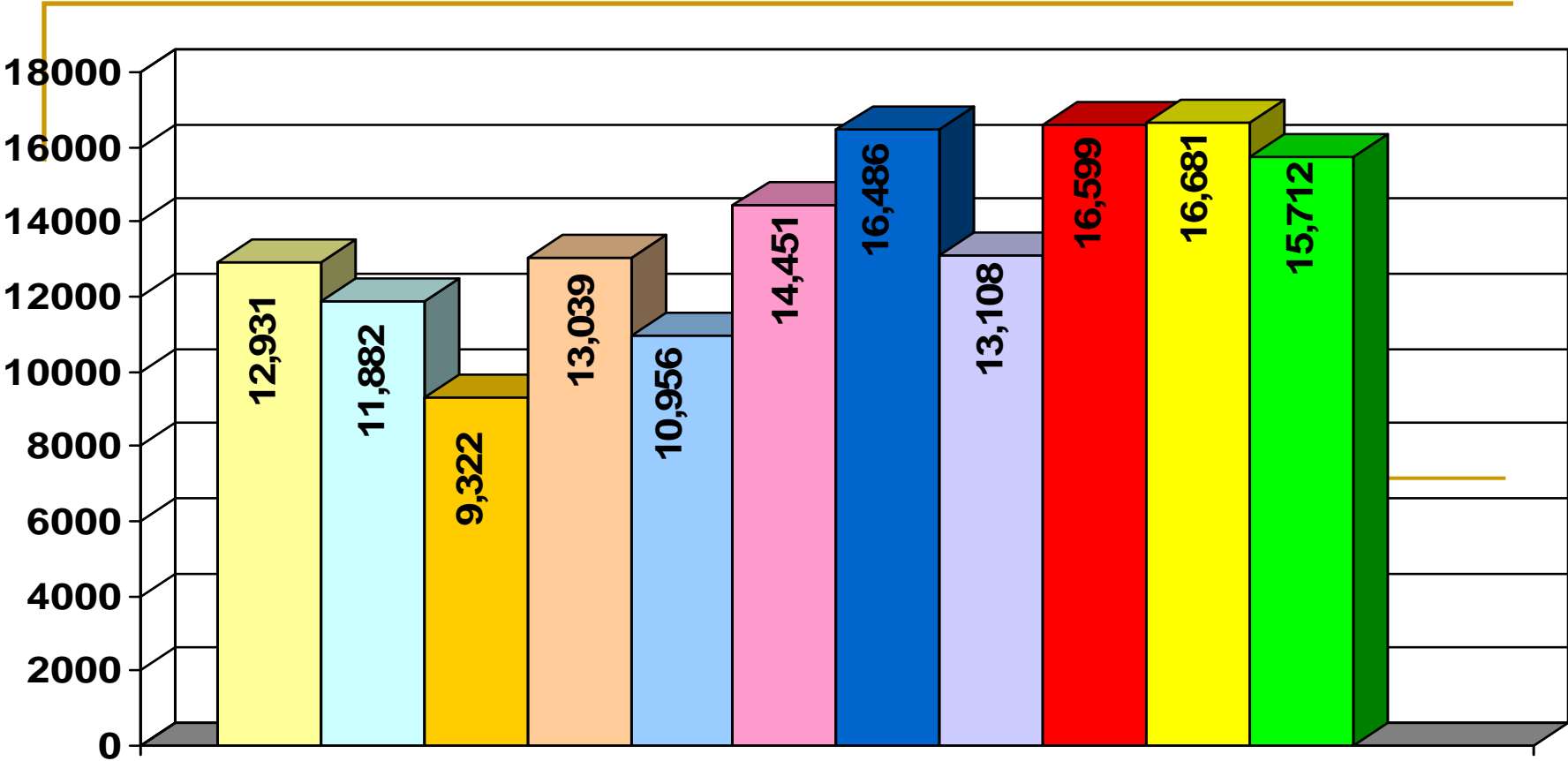
MILES DRIVEN

MILES DRIVEN 2007-2008



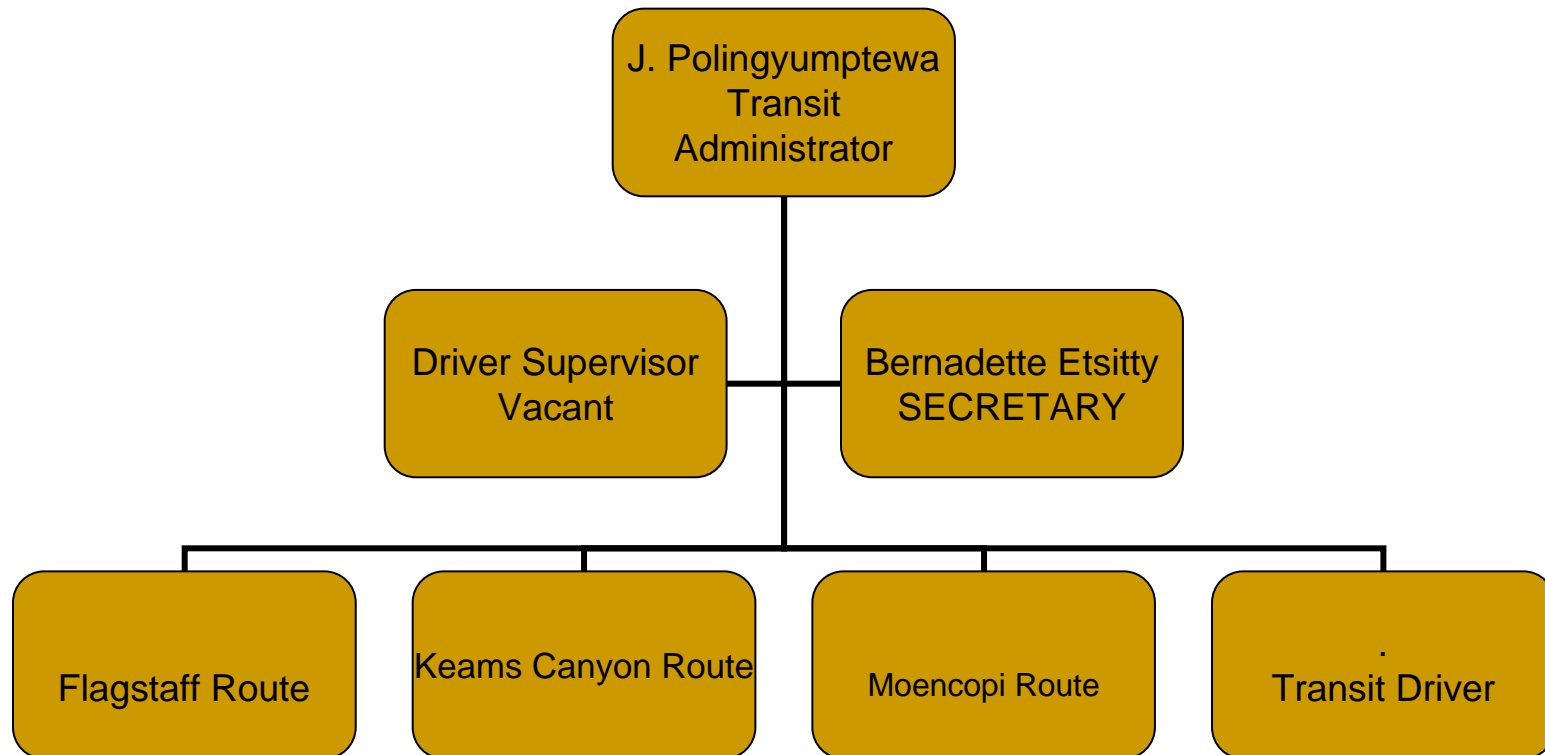

Office Location/Hours of Service

- The Hopi Senom Transit program is housed on the premises of the Hopi Tribal Complex in a modular trailer. It shares office space and equipment with the Tutuvehni (Tribal newspaper), Loss Prevention Specialist and the Claims Specialist.
